

Throughout the whole concert everyone was clinging on to their little young voices lights and waving them around. They introduced us to Urban Striders; an amazing dance group that blew everyone away with their street dance. Then there was MC Grammar who is a rapper and rapped music while we sang. He loves books and is amazing at rapping. Another highlight was Nandi - a fantastic drummer - who has played across the world with lots of different bands and amazingly, she is only 13! Yew Class - Peppered Moth

On Wednesday, while most of the class was at Young Voices, the remaining Yew Class children enjoyed a cross curricular day revolving around the peppered moth. We have been learning about the peppered moth in Science and English. The children made an animated recount on the history of the peppered moth using 2Animate. They then made peppered moths using salt and pepper for effect. After that the children made a peppered moth that could balance on the end of a pencil or on the end of their noses due to changing the moth's centre of gravity. The moths made a fine display.
