Place Value

Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number

Read numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals

Given a number, identify one more and one less

Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations

Sequence events in chronological order using language such as before, and, after, next and first.

Mental Maths (half term)

Count on and back from 0-20, find 1 more/less than any number to 20 $\,$

Addition and subtraction

Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20 Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and missing number problems. Read, write, and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs

Measurement

Compare and describe lengths and heights and solve practical problems Use comparative language – long/short, longer/shorter

Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.

Recognise and use language relating to dates, including days of the week, weeks, months and years.

Tell the time to the hour.
