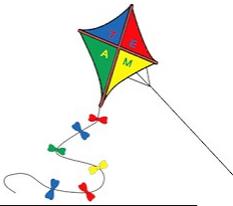

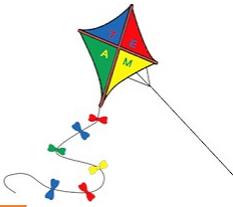

The Iron Man: Writing an alternative ending	The Iron Man: Non-chronological report
<p>Writing is clear in purpose</p> <p>Plan their writing by discussing writing similar to that which they are planning to write in order to understand and learn from its structure, vocabulary and grammar</p> <p>When planning, discuss and record ideas</p> <p>Compose and rehearse sentences orally (including dialogue), progressively building a varied and rich vocabulary</p> <p>In narratives, create settings, characters and plot</p> <p>Organise writing into logical chunks and write a coherent series of linked sentences for each</p> <p>Some sentence variation through sentence type, length and structure</p> <p>Description or detail in both narrative and non-narrative is expanded through an appropriate and precise range of vocabulary</p> <p>Viewpoint is consistently maintained (for example, word choice indicates child's viewpoint on a character or an issue)</p> <p>Use figurative language such as similes, alliteration to build a picture in the reader's head</p> <p>Variation in sentence structure includes simple, compound and complex structures</p>	<p>Use simple organisational devices, e.g. headings and subheadings</p> <p>Draft and write an increasing range of sentence structures (simple and compound)</p> <p>Plan their writing by discussing writing similar to that which they are planning to write in order to understand and learn from its structure, vocabulary and grammar</p> <p>Evaluate and edit by assessing the effectiveness of their own and others' writing and suggesting improvements</p> <p>Organise writing into logical chunks and write a coherent series of linked sentences for each</p> <p>Use adverbs and prepositions to express time, place and cause</p> <p>Discuss writing similar to that which they are planning to write in order to understand and learn from its structure, vocabulary and grammar</p> <p>Non-narrative material uses simple organisational devices</p> <p>Use conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause for cohesion</p> <p>Proof-read for spelling and punctuation errors</p> <p>Evaluate and edit by assessing the effectiveness of their own and others' writing and suggesting improvements</p>
