They could be hi-tech or low tech.</p> <p>Which tool or technology could you absolutely not live without?</p> <p>Write a short explanation of why it is so vital to your life and why you couldn't live without it.</p> 	<p>Top 10 facts</p> <p>Create a poster to present your top ten facts about the Stone Age. Can you find some facts to wow your friends and family?</p> 	<p>Monu-mental!</p> <p>Stonehenge is a very famous Stone Age monument, but not all henges were made from stone - wood was also commonly used.</p> <p>Design and build your own henge from materials you have at home or that you can scavenge from nature.</p> <p>Think carefully about how you want it to look, and what the purpose of your henge is. Be creative!</p>

You could even try and make your own paint by using natural materials such as crushed berries, sticks, grass and leaves.</p> 
<p>#PowerforGood</p> <p>Write a thank you letter to someone who you think has done a great job or helped you in some way.</p> <p>Challenge: Be a nice ninja</p> <p>Do something nice for someone and don't let them know it was you!</p> 	<p>The Hills are Alive!</p> <p>Create a song to help you remember a times table - it could be as simple as a chant.</p> <p>Bonus Points: create a music video for your song (get an adult to bust out their dance moves!)</p> 	<p>Quiz Time!</p> <p>Create a Stone Age quiz for your friends and family. How will they score? Make sure you do your research so you can include some tricky questions!</p>
