


# Sycamore Home Learning: Spring 2

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Sun dials</b></p> <p>Using your knowledge about light and shadows, create your own sundial</p>  <p style="text-align: center;">This example is made using a paper plate and a pencil.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Signs of Spring</b></p> <p>Spring is on its way and already there are small signs that new life is emerging.</p> <p>Make a diary over the course of the half term to document the changes you see.</p> <p>You could use drawings, diagrams, a photo collage or writing to show how things are changing in your local environment.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Celtic Houses</b></p> <p>Boudicca was a member of the Iceni tribe, one of many in Celtic Britain.</p> <p>Research how Celts would have lived in the time of the Roman invasion and try and make a model of types of houses they would have lived in.</p> 
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Make a height chart</b></p> <p>We have been practising how to measure length using rulers and tape measures. We have then been converting the measurements between cm and mm and m and cm.</p> <p>Measure the people in your family and put them into height order (maybe you could use cuddly toys instead) Could you then convert the measurements from m to cm? You could even try converting into mm if you wanted a challenge!</p> <p>You could then present this data in a table, a picture or a graph.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Must do reading job:</u></b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Pick a book which you wouldn't normally consider reading. You might usually read fiction so try a non-fiction book or vice versa.</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Write a book review of the book.</b> <b>What did you like about it? What surprised you? Would you recommend it to others?</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Writing</b></p> <p>Imagine you are Boudicca and want to encourage others from the Iceni tribe to join the flight against the Romans.</p> <p>Write a speech with the reasons why others should rebel against the invaders.</p> 
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>A Roman Feast</b></p> <p>We have loved seeing the Roman bread which so many of you have made.</p> <p>Why not try and make some more authentic Roman treats? Here are some delicacies which you could research and try to make:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">-Globuli Libum</p> <p>Or you could research your own and write out the recipe to share with others</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Times Table</b></p> <p>Consider which times table you need more practise with. Create a set of flash cards for that times table.</p> <p>Once you have made them, work with an adult to practise learning it using the flash cards.</p> <p>You could time yourself. How quick can you get at recalling them?</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>History</b></p> <p>Create a poster to encourage young Romans to join the army.</p> <p>You could research the benefits of being a Roman soldier compared to other Roman professions.</p>
